The Center's human resources professionals are helping job seekers of all levels prepare for the future with free one-on-one resume reviews and interview coaching sessions by phone

MIAMI, FL May 14, 2020 – As part of its recently launched [Arsht@Home](#) virtual arts program, the Arsht Center ([@arshtcenter](#)) is helping job seekers get ready for their next job with free professional development training via [Arsht@Work](#). Led by the Center's human resources team, Arsht@Work aims to help job seekers from all industries with free one-on-one, 30-minute interview coaching and resume review sessions. Since the program's inception in early April, the Center has coached nearly 100 people of all ages, ethnicities, and educational backgrounds, and hopes to continue broadening its reach to help more job seekers in South Florida and beyond.

- Match your career story to your resume.
- Have a 30-second answer to "Tell me about yourself."
- Have clarity on what job you want, why you want it and why you are qualified.
- Pick three companies you would like to work for and research everything about them to your full advantage.
- Use your resume to highlight your past results, not your to-do list.
