HOW TO BREAK IN A GLOVE - WORLD PREMIERE

Set in 1999 Miami, the play follows an 11-year-old boy clinging to the fractured pieces of his Cuban American family: an iron-willed grandfather, a devoted but weary grandmother, a father fighting for relevance, and a mother torn between rebellion and responsibility. When a single night of crisis rips open buried tensions, love and survival collide in a battle for connection, legacy, and the desperate need to belong. Like a well-worn baseball glove, they must break in their bonds—stretching, softening, and learning to hold on before it's too late.

This is the first full-length world premiere to emerge from <u>City Theatre's Homegrown playwright</u> <u>development program</u>. Shaped through workshops, readings, and mentorship as part of Homegrown, this new play is a testament to the power of investing in local voices and amplifying the stories that define Miami.

Zoetic Stage was founded in 2010 to create fresh, bold interpretations of contemporary plays and musicals, and is dedicated to enhancing South Florida's national artistic profile by producing regional premieres and developing new works to become part of the American stage repertoire.

In 2020, Zoetic Stage was named the Best Theater Company by the Miami New Times. The theater has been nominated for an impressive 140 Carbonell Awards (of which 15 were for Best Production of the Year) and won 45, including six for Best New Work and four for Best Production of a Play or Musical. Zoetic Stage productions have received 48 Silver Palm Awards for Outstanding Achievement.

The company commissions new plays for its SHORT CUTS tour for young audiences and offers year-round community engagement through CITY READS—an interactive short play reading series presented in partnership with Books & Books, Pinecrest Gardens, and the Village of Key Biscayne. City Theatre's HOMEGROWN playwright development initiative was launched to nurture, elevate, and amplify Miami's most promising emerging writers from historically marginalized communities. This program develops plays that reflect the city's multicultural voices and presents them as part of City Theatre's season. Since 2007, City Theatre has made its mainstage home at the Adrienne Arsht Center for the Performing Arts' Carnival Studio Theater. Its signature SUMMER SHORTS FESTIVAL celebrated its 25th anniversary in 2022. The company also produces full-length plays as part of the Arsht Center's Theatre Up Close Series, including BLACK SANTA by Aaron Mays (2024), Carmen Rivera's LA GRINGA (2023), and Heidi Schreck's WHAT THE CONSTITUTION MEANS TO ME (2022).
